# **Script for Ah Counter**

Description: The Ah Counter helps all the people who speak in the meeting with filler words and other language ticks. Actual script (words you would say aloud) are in *italics*.



### **Beginning of the Meeting**

Good evening, fellow toastmasters and dear guests.

As the ah-counter, I will be listening for things that detract from our speech such as inappropriate words or sounds used as a 'space filler.'

'Space fillers' can be words such as and, well, but, so and you know.

Inappropriate sounds may be things like **ah**, **um** or **er**.

I will also note when a speaker repeats a word or phrase such as "I, I" or "This means, this means."

At the end of the meeting, I'll provide my report.

#### WHAT TO LOOK FOR AS 'AH COUNTER'

- Does the overused word actually detract from the flow of the speech? For example, if the sentence can work without the word, it likely is a filler word. If it flows in the sentence, it may not be a filler as you should use your judgement.
- Filler sounds like 'ah' and 'um' always detract but overused words only sometimes detract.
- If a member particularly an experienced member has a habit of overusing a particular word and addressing it would help them speak better, it's usually good to point it out even if it is not a filler sound.

## Giving your Report (aim for under 2 minutes)

- For most speakers, group into "A lot"(>=10), "Some"(5-10) and "A few" (<5).
  - "Bill, you used a lot of filler words" is better than "Bill, 17 'ums', 13 'ahs' ...".
  - For Guests who do Table Topics, it's much better to use 'some' or 'a lot'.
- Exception: If you hear a member that struggles with a particular filler, you can point that out. "Bill, you used some filler words. For you, 'you know' is one to work on."
- If someone used no filler words, point that out!
- You can combine people in the report as well: "Bill, Dave and Steve, you each used a lot of filler words".
